### PROJECT UPDATES

#### MARKET STREET

The Market Street sewer lining project is nearly complete. This grant-funded project will accomplish two major goals: protect the environment, specifically the Pocomoke River watershed, from infiltration of wastewater from the Town's sewer system and recapture capacity at our wastewater treatment plant, opening the doors to new development, benefitting our economic base and presenting new opportunities for growth in jobs and housing.

#### **PURNELL STREET**

The Purnell Street Utility & Roadway Improvements Project has received the final go-ahead for funding by the Maryland Board of Public Works. A pre-construction meeting took place the first week of January with start of construction expected by mid to late February. A construction period of 90 to 120 days is anticipated with new water & sewer lines, curbing, drainage, street and sidewalk repairs all in the plan.

#### WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

With the hiring of a new plant superintendent, Snow Hill continues to make great strides making repairs and bringing our plant into compliance with State permits. Much remains to be done and Town leadership and staff are working diligently to secure the necessary funding to make it happen.

### STURGIS PARK RESTROOM REHABILITATION

A second round of bidding has been opened for the grant funded rehabilitation of the Sturgis Park restrooms. Once a successful bidder is chosen, the project will commence and should be completed by late Spring.

### Community Legacy Grant returns in the Spring!

The Town has been awarded \$50,000 from the State's "Community Legacy" program for the upcoming Fiscal Year 2024, administered by the Department of Housing and Community Development. The program has multiple purposes, including improvements to business properties; the development of mixed-use projects; streetscape improvements; and the acquisition or improvement of vacant buildings.

Projects that improve the value and aesthetic/historical character of a business structure will receive the highest consideration. Projects that improve accessibility, health and safety, and business development will also receive high consideration. Detailed information about eligible projects will be provided before the application period opens later this spring.

# Julia A. Purnell Museum Adds 1840s Painting to its Collection Dr. Cynthia Byrd Executive Director January 5, 2024

The museum has received the donation of a large mid-1800s painting depicting Jane Holland Townsend Quigg (1835-1913) and Mary Ann Holland Porter (1822-1861). The portrait is the gift of Helen Regan of Brunswick, Maine, a descendant of the family.

Mary Ann Holland Porter was the mother of James Porter Townsend (1856–1910). James was the cashier at First National Bank, and his wife Helen Jones Townsend was the sister of Dr. Paul Jones. The painter is unknown but was likely an itinerant artist. These artists often traveled with canvases prepared with the background scene completed and ready for the addition of the sitter. Museum staff are excited to display this piece of Snow Hill's history this winter!
